Go Make Disciples

A disciple of Jesus is one who:

- Studies the Words of Jesus
- Imitates in the Ways of Jesus
- Partners in the Mission of Jesus

Empowered by the Holy Spirit within the context of community we learn to live our lives from Jesus and invite others to do the same.

5 Discipleship Anchors

- 2. Discipleship is rooted in relationship.

- 5. Discipleship is measured by multiplication.

What would our lives look like if we were so deeply anchored in the Holy Spirit -- that He fuels us-- propels us-- to gain greater heights than our own abilities could?

Acts 1:8a

We are empowered SO THAT we can partner with Him. He's moving & active.

"What the Holy Spirit initiates, he permeates and sustains." (Discipleship Theology, NCC).

John 3:8

Surrendering -- requires a posture of submission to fully trust Him -- even if it stretches & challenges my paradigm & patterns of thinking -- because it is more about the move of God (in community) than it is about me.

Genesis 2:7

Discipleship is a Holy Spirit-empowered process // within the context of community // as we learn to live our lives from Jesus // and invite others to do the same.

There is SIMPLY something powerful about the table.

Discipleship flourishes when we become intentional with how we show up to the table.

"Making disciples" demands intentionality, commitment, and perseverance.

We are called to actively make disciples -- not converts.

Disciples first come and see, then come and follow, and then come and surrender the entirety of their lives to Him.

Daily obedience that leads to transformation.

Integration means that Jesus doesn't want to be the first in a list of priorities; rather, He desires to be central to every other priority in our lives.

Integration starts from the inside and works its way out.

Integration is letting Jesus be as original with others as He was with you.

The incongruity you feel in your soul is often reconciled by the integration of Jesus into all of you.

The God who is in all things, above all things, sustaining all things, and filling all things... He made you to experience Him by fully integrating all of Him in all of you, from thought to word to deed.

Discipleship is about integrating the words of Jesus, the ways of Jesus, and the mission of Jesus into all the dimensions of my life -- where I work, play and live.

Often the way that you grow as a disciple is by becoming a disciple maker.

Discipleship is Measured by Multiplication...Multiplication is a product of our surrender and obedience.

Jesus doesn't just save you from or call you out but He calls you to and He also works in and through you.

Galatians 2:20

When we give Christ our lives. When we surrender to Him. We're giving Him permission to live in and through us.

Matthew 16:24-25

Surrender produces direction.

John 14:23

Our obedience provides connection

When we are obedient, what we are communicating is that our love for Jesus is central and important to our lives that we are going to follow after Your ways - Your words - and Your mission.

As we are poured into, it allows us to pour out.

The invitation is to become a disciple, and a disciple maker!
