Opening Question: Five years from now, do you expect your life to be as good or better than your current one?

When Hope goes down we often operate out of fear, worry, despair, desperation, and out of self.

Hope - something that is grounded in possibility and probability

To actively hope in Christ is to live and work in CONFIDENCE with an eternal perspective on all the events of our life.

Romans 5:1-5

Hope is based on what's possible. It is about a CONFIDENT hope in a God who accomplishes these things.

What you EXPECT and what you BELIEVE about your future WILL BE the PRIMARY FACTOR in how you live out your calling in this season of life.

Ordinary Hope vs. Theological Hope

1 Peter 1:3

FOUR CHALLENGES OF HOPE:

- 1. Hope comes in the midst of obstacles
- "Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope."

- 2. Hope is active waiting
- Psalm 130:5-8
