4 Characteristics of Parables

- Engaging story- it's engaging and memorable
- Ethical example- it gives a model to follow
- Theological teaching- it it reveals something about the character of God and his kingdom
- Christological revelation- some parables unveil something about who Jesus is and what he is about.

Proverbs 14:4

Are we willing to make decisions against our convenience?

Are we willing to make decisions against our comfort?

The Risky Act of Showing Compassion

Are we willing to make decisions against our security?

There are three places in the Old Testament where the linguistic construction ve' ahavta ("and you shall love") occurs.

<u>Deuteronomy 6:5</u> - "Love (ve' ahavta) the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength."

<u>Leviticus 19:18</u> - "...love (ve' ahavta) your neighbor as yourself"

<u>Leviticus 19:34</u> - "...The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love (ve' ahavta) them as yourself..."

Jesus strings these together to build his teaching that his love and the love we should show others is limitless.
