## Note to Leaders:

This weekend we were challenged with real life examples of brave. These questions provide a framework to prompt or foster discussion. Don't feel you must use all or any of these questions and you don't have to make it to the end! Use the questions that best fit your group and let discussion flow. You can also use these questions on your own to dive deeper into this week's sermon.

## Sermon Series Questions:

1. What did God reveal to you?
2. What are you going to do about it?
3. What is one element of God's character you learned?

## Specific Questions:

1. "There is God that exists in my neighbors." Who are your neighbors? What ways can you listen, learn, and love on the God within your neighbors?
2. "You don't have to share the same language to share a meal." Who can you share a meal with that is different from you?
3. "It takes a thousand insignificant moments to create a significant moment." What insignificant moments in your life led to a significant moment in another person's life?
4. "A lot of us have an ignorance to what is going on around us." Is there anything you are ignoring around you? Are there any opportunities to serve and love on people you ignore? If so, how can you rectify this?
5. During your silent prayer after the sermon, what BRAVE dream did God reveal to you?
