Message Overview

Mindset is defined by Merriam-Webster as a mental attitude or a fixed state of mind. Our mindset is what determines what we do and how we engage the world around us. The Apostle Paul wrote to Jesus followers in a place called Philippi, in part, urging them to be spiritually mature and not to pursue Earthly things. Instead, he encouraged a heavenly mindset, in pursuit of God's calling.

Message-Specific Discussion Questions

Take some time to think about what your MENTAL TENACITY looks like. How do you go about strengthening that?

What are you allowing into your mind? What are your GATEWAYS?

Pastor Joshua talked about the importance of having others around us to keep us on track. A strong community helps us to pursue the good things that God has for us. WHO are you surrounding yourself with? WHO is your Christ - led community?

What does it look like to have your life centered around **HEAVEN FIRST?**
