The Best is Yet to Come: From Languishing to Flourishing

Nehemiah 1:1

God doesn't call the qualified.

GOD QUALIFIES THE CALLED.

Your strong hand symbolizes the gifts that God has given to you.

Your weak hand symbolizes the things that don't come naturally.

God wants to use that weak hand because His power is made perfect in weakness.

That's how God gets the glory, He does things that you can't take credit for.

Go after a dream that is destined to fail without divine intervention. That's what Nehemiah does.

Nehemiah 1:2-3 - Two times it says SURVIVE. It's the Hebrew word *shaar* and it means left over or left behind. The Hebrew root means TO SWELL UP. It's emotional inflammation. These Jewish refugees are living in SURVIVAL MODE. They are languishing.

What makes you CRY or POUND YOUR FIST on the table? You have to pay attention to those emotions because those emotions often double as God-ordained passions.

Nehemiah sat down and WEPT.

If something causes you to WEEP, maybe God is trying to get your attention. If something causes you to pound your fist on the table—to mourn and fast and pray for days on end—it's a pretty good indication that God wants you to do something about it.

Psalm 56:8

Some of you need to CRY out to the Lord.

Some of you need to intercede with your tears.

Most of us will never see the inside of a prison cell but we are a prisoner to experiences in our past. We let the enemy hold us hostage.

Romans 8:1
